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Essential Services Delivered by Volunteers

Volunteers and volunteer involving organisations assist the Tasmanian community through the delivery of essential services. It is not the purpose of this work to place higher value on certain volunteer roles but rather identify in the event of a pandemic or similar disaster, which services are essential in providing vital support to our community during emergency events.

The State Government defines essential services as;

- Services or supplies that if not available will significantly increase the likelihood of death or undermine key life sustaining functions of government.
- Services or supplies whose loss will have a significant impact on functioning of the community or its safety including health and financial security of individuals and families.

Based on this description of essential services, and the services delivered by volunteers during the Covid-19 pandemic and other natural disasters, such as fires and floods, the following categories have been identified as essential services that are delivered and dependant on volunteers and volunteer involving organisations.
