# Winners announced for the 2023 Tasmanian Volunteering Awards

This year's Tasmanian Volunteering Awards culminated with an awards ceremony held at Government House in Hobart on 19 May. The awards acknowledge and honour the incredible contribution and spirit of service of all Tasmanian volunteers and signify the importance of National Volunteer Week (15-21 May).

The Honourable Justice Alan Blow AO, Lieutenant Governor of Tasmania, hosted the 27 finalists, their nominators, industry sponsors and VIPs at the official awards ceremony.

Nic Street, the Minister for Hospitality and Events, Minister for Community Services and Development, Minister for Sport and Recreation, and Minister for Local Government presented the Premier's Tasmanian Volunteer of the Year Award to Julie Porter.

Julie is the driving force behind the award-winning tourism experience onboard the oldest and smallest operating tall ship in Hobart, SV Rhona H. She manages all aspects of the ship's operations, the sailing schedule, bookings, website, social media, and crew roster, while coordinating 34 volunteers from a variety of backgrounds. Julie brings her best to the ship and encourages others to do the same.
